I-10 East between Mesa and Executive will be reduced to 2 lanes during the day all week.
At night, be mindful of various ramp closures and lane closures on I-10.

I-10 @ Executive

Overnight

Sunday, Sept. 24 through Tuesday, Sept. 26

9 p.m. each night to 6 a.m. each morning

- The Executive Center Exit Ramp (Exit 16) from I-10 Westbound will close.

Crews will be working on nearby utilities. [No Map]

Overnight

Monday, Sept. 25

9 p.m. to 6 a.m. the next morning

- The left lane on I-10 Westbound will close between the Executive Center Exit Ramp and the Buena Vista area.

Crews will repair a crash attenuator. [No Map]

Overnight

Monday, Sept. 25 and Tuesday, Sept. 26

9 p.m. each night to 6 a.m. each morning

- I-10 Eastbound will be reduced to two lanes starting at approximately 1,000 feet before the Executive Center Exit Ramp (Exit 16). The closed lanes will open at the Schuster Exit (Exit 18A). All exit ramps and entrance ramps will remain open.

Crews will be conducting pavement work.

Monday, Sept. 25 through Friday, Sept 29

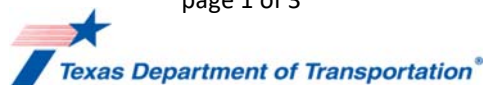
9 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily

- The left lane on I-10 Eastbound will close between the North Mesa Overpass and the Executive Center Overpass.

All entrance ramps and exit ramps will be open. Two lanes will remain open at all times.

Crews will be cleaning storm drains and breaking illumination foundations. [Map 1]

I-10 @ Sunland



Overnight

Tuesday, Sept. 26

9 p.m. to 6 a.m. the next morning

- I-10 Eastbound will close **completely** between the Sunland Exit Ramp (Exit 13) and the Sunland Entrance Ramp.
- The Sunland Park Drive Overpass at I-10 will close in both directions.

DETOURS: Traffic on I-10 Eastbound will take the Sunland Park Exit (Exit 13) and immediately re-enter I-10 East at the next entrance ramp. Traffic on Sunland Park Drive will not be able to use the Sunland Park Overpass and should follow the detour signs in place.

Crews continue to build the all-new I-10/Sunland Park interchange. [Map 2]

Overnight

Monday, Sept. 25 and Thursday, Sept. 28

9 p.m. each night to 6 a.m. each morning

- The Sunland Park Entrance Ramp to I-10 West will close.
- The Sunland Park Flyover Entrance Ramp to I-10 East will close.

DETOURS: Instead of entering I-10 West from the Sunland Park Entrance Ramp, motorists may Sunland Park Drive to Doniphan Drive, then take Doniphan Drive to North Mesa Street (SH 20). Traffic may enter I-10 West using the North Mesa Entrance Ramp. Traffic on Sunland Park Drive may access I-10 East using the Sunland Park Entrance Ramp accessible from the Sunland/Paisano intersection.

Crews will be pouring bridge deck onto the new Sunland Park Flyover Ramp. [Map 3]

ALL CLOSURES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

All closure times are approximate.

Ramps may close up to 1 hour prior to the start time of an I-10 highway closure.

The following closures are tentative. Details such as dates and closure limits could change.

Overnight

Sunday, Oct. 1

9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

- The Executive Center Exit Ramp (Exit 16) from I-10 Eastbound will close.

Overnight

Monday, Oct. 2 and Tuesday, Oct. 3

9 p.m. to 6 a.m.

- I-10 Westbound at Sunland Park will close.
- The Sunland Entrance Ramp to I-10 Eastbound (in front of the Shamaley dealership) will close.

Overnight

Wednesday, Oct. 4 and Thursday, Oct. 5

9 p.m. to 6 a.m.

- I-10 Eastbound at Sunland Park will close.

Overnight

Thursday, Oct. 5

9 p.m. to 6 a.m.

- Sunland Park Overpass will close in both directions.
- I-10 in both directions will close at Sunland Park.

I-10 East @ Redd

Overnight

Tuesday, Oct. 10 through Thursday, Oct. 12

9 p.m. each night to 6 a.m. each morning

- I-10 Eastbound will close **completely** between the Redd Road Exit (Exit 9) and the Resler Flyover Ramp.
- North Mesa Street (SH 20) at the I-10 Overpass will be closed in both directions.
- The North Mesa Entrance Ramp to I-10 Eastbound will close.

Detour: Traffic on I-10 East will exit at Redd Road (Exit 9), take Redd Road to Doniphan Drive, then take Doniphan Drive to Sunland Park Drive. Traffic may re-enter I-10 East at the Sunland Park Entrance Ramp. Follow the detour signs in place.

Crews will be setting numerous giant beams at the I-10/North Mesa interchange.
